After a dormant period, the club is being rebuilt as the Ventura Canoe & Kayak Club. Club membership can be for anyone 12 years old and up.


OUR MISSION

- Be kind, even when others may not be in return.






MEMBERSHIP & RECRUITING

EQUIPMENT INVENTORY: BOATS

HIGHLIGHTS FOR THE YEAR

- Successful 501(c)3 reclassification from Private Foundation to Public Charity.
- Over \$7,000 of *Gifts in Kind* donations including a new *Stellar Kayaks* K1, and a used K1 and K2.
- Trailer upgrades; new wheels and tires, plus new foam and ropes for the racks.
- We purchased two *Lightning* K1 trainers and four Gara ultralight kayak paddles.
- All sprint boats now have fabric covers.

Gifts in Kind was again our largest source of contributions followed by Individual Contributions. Patagonia provided matching funds equaling \$1,850, and dues provided \$30 of income.

Total funding for the year: \$13,447.50


Amount does **not** include proceeds from our Giving Tuesday fundraiser which will provide us with an additional \$1,396


EXPENSES

In 2019, the bulk of our expenses was in rental of the dry storage space at the Ventura Harbor. This year, we purchased two Lightning K1 trainers and four Gara ultralight kayak paddles with covers.

We also spent \$400 to get our 501(c)3 successfully reclassified from being a *Private Foundation* to *Public Charity*.
